Marriage of Nicolas Nouvion and Reine Breuse

1 June 1724

As indicated in the marriage act, the father, Nicolas Nouvion, was the son of the deceased Nicolas du Nouvion and the deceased Antoinette Brunois from the parish of (St-Rémy) la Neuville-lès-Dorenge. In the marriage act Nicolas, Jr., was said to be 22 ½ years old, which would place his birth around 1700-1702. Both Nicolas, Jr., and Nicolas, Sr., were shepherds.

FIIL microfilm #1783961 (Covers the years 1669-1720 and appears to be the copy of the original. There is another filming #2002799 which covers the years 1669-1709 and also other years into the 1700s. This film also needs to be checked.)

There were no children born for the Nouvion family in la Neuville-lès-Dorenge in the years 1698, 1699, 1700.

5 June 1701- Marie
